## AN INTRODUCTION OF PERSIAN MANUSCRIPT HERITAGE IN

## RESEARCH LIBRARY UNIVERSITY OF KASHMIR

The research library under Directorate of Libraries, Govt. of Jammu and Kashmir was established in 1879 at Jammu named as SRS library followed by establishing SPS library at Srinagar in 1898. In 1904, the Department of Research and Publication was established and, in 1919, the SPS library was separated from the SPS museum and brought under the control of Department of Research and Publication. Since 1879, the department is engaged in the dissemination of knowledge and information by providing free library and reading room facilities to people of Jammu and Kashmir through this network1 .In this library, there is a total collection of precisely about 5506 manuscripts and it can be considered as one of the richest repositories of manuscripts not only in India but also in Asian sub-continent. Different scripts like Nastaliq, Naskh, Sarda, Devnagri etc and diverse languages have been used for writing these manuscripts. These manuscripts are written on various materials including birch bark, cloth and handmade papers and cover a variety of subjects including archery, architecture, arts, astrology, drama, ayurvedha, grammar, history, literature, meditation, poetry, religion and philosophy. These manuscripts are treasures of vast expense of knowledge to be helpful for scholars in their research work. A good number of credible research papers and publications on Kashmir have their source material originating from these manuscripts2.

Manuscripts have been digitalised and have been made available in DVD format in order to preserve this wealth of information and wisdom for prosperity by National Mission for the Manuscripts. These digitalised manuscripts are yet to be archived that form part of our automation and networking of public libraries project. The next step will be that the information about these manuscripts will be available on the web. Besides this, their storage on scientific lines is also being taken care of. These manuscripts have been stored in fire proof storage in the research library3.

Its collection has two major divisions: The Persian/Arabic and the Sanskrit. The former has a total of 3364 manuscripts including 2349 in Persian, 719 in Arabic, 198 in Kashmiri, 67 in Urdu, and a few in other languages. The Sanskrit division, with 2142 manuscripts includes 1939 in Sanskrit, 8 in Punjabi, 3 in Dogri, 186 multi-languages and 3 each in English and Tibetan languages4.

The Persian manuscripts incorporate wide range of subjects like Astrology, literature, Sufism, Geography, Biography,

Philosophy, Medicine, History, Islamic jurisprudence, Prosody, Ethics, so on and so forth. Some of the very rich collections include:

Besides, some of the wonderful manuscripts present in the Research library are bi-lingual and tri-lingual i.e., written in more than one languages particularly in Persian/Sanskrit and Hindi. Actually, some works are originally presented in Persian and the contents have been translated in Sanskrit and Hindi. For others the case is reverse. The works are originally in Sanskrit and the same have been translated in Persian or/and Hindi in the same volume by the same author. Hereunder, mention may be made of a few of them.

The Directorate of libraries has been endeavouring hard to publish the manuscripts for the benefit of scholars. So far, the publication of manuscripts is mandatory now. About 112 manuscripts have been published in its original languages including Sivasutra Vimarmshine in Sanskrit, the oldest book on the Idealistic Monism or Advaita Saivagama of Kashmir, Kashmir Saivism, a brief introduction of the history, literature etc 14.

The library is an abode for the scholars to un-reveal the embedded pearls of knowledge in these manuscripts. Till date very few scholars including from the P.G Deptt. of Persian, University of Kashmir with the dire efforts of the present Head of the Deptt. Of Persian, *Professor Syeda Rukaya*, have shouldered this grave responsibility and have encouraged many scholars to edit, translate and evaluate them. Till date the scholars and the faculity of the Department of Persian have worked (edited & translated) upon the following manuscripts of the Research Library and, besides, some have worked upon these manuscripts for their M.Phill and P.hD. programmes:
